Our learning for this week:

English	I can differentiate between fact and opinion I can understand the 5Ws in context of a newspaper I can understand the use of speech marks I can understand what the main body in the newspaper should consist of
Handwriting	Focussing joints of 'ake' and 'ous'.
Maths	I can convert between analogue and digital times using a format up to 12 hours. I can recognize that digital time needs to be written in 4-digit format. I can convert between analogue and digital times using a 24 hour clock. I can use the 12 and 24 hour digital clocks, and a number line, to explore what happens after midday.
International Week activities	Children will be invited to research into various aspects of the class's chosen country, such as: Its Culture, customs and geography; Famous landmarks, flag, food language, money and historical events. Dressing up in national costume or in their adopted country's national colours
