Our learning for this week:

English	I can imagine and write about a day being on board on Titanic as a child I can respond to giving feedback on work I can write a summary in the conclusion of my writing I can edit my concluding paragraph and give feedback on others
Handwriting	Focussing joints of ‘rec’ and ‘es’.
Maths	I can multiply and divide by 1,000 to convert between kilometres and metres. I can find fractions of kilometres, using knowledge of finding fractions of amounts. I can calculate the perimeter of rectilinear shapes by counting squares on a grid. I can label the length of each side and mark off each side.
Topic	To gain an understanding of a historical event from different sources (why the ship sunk) I can plan a poster with details on the sinking of the Titanic
Science	I can identify common appliances that need electricity To construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs.
Spelling	remember sentence separate special straight strange strength suppose surprise therefore though although through thought weight woman women evidence
